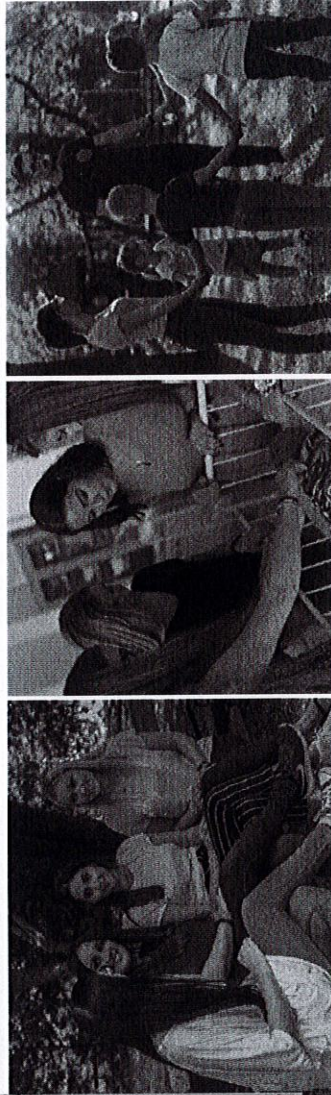
Educational Sciences

Environmental Engineering

MSc | 4 semesters | English

The programme objective is to train environmental engineers with up-to-date scientific, ecological, engineering, economic, and management knowledge to enable them to identify and assess the existing and potential environmental threats, to prevent or reduce environmental damage, and to prepare and manage damage control projects. You may continue your studies in the doctoral programme.

MAIN SUBJECTS: Natural Sciences, Economics and Humanities; Environmental engineering knowledge; Specialization provided by the training institute

Nature Conservation Engineering

MSc | 4 semesters | English

The programme objective is to train nature conservation engineers to plan, organize, and manage general and special nature conservation tasks at an international level. You will vindicate nature conservation principles and regulations efficiently through the application of acquired theoretical knowledge. You may continue your studies in the doctoral program.

Forestry and Wildlife Management

PhD | 4 + 4 semesters | English

The Doctoral School has eight programmes which encompass all the branches and interfaces of forestry and wildlife management sciences. Education and research at the doctoral school are pursued in the basic and applied sciences related to forests, wildlife, and nature. It is the only doctoral school in Hungary where all the

personnel and material conditions are provided for an independent doctoral school in these areas of science.

Central European Forestry

PART-TIME STUDY PROGRAM

This discipline provides you an understanding of ecological conditions and delimitations of forestry in Central Europe. 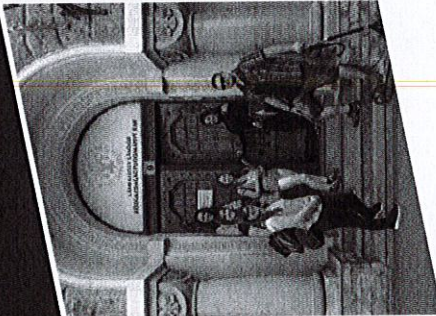
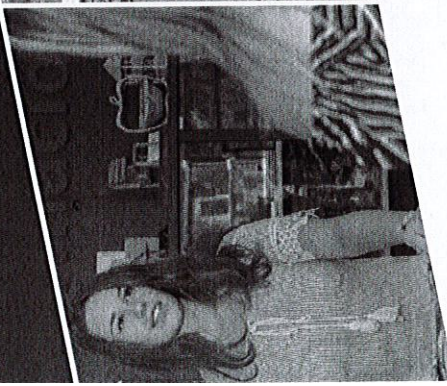

BA | 6 semesters + 2 semesters internship | English

This discipline provides you an extensive understanding of international markets and teaches you to manage cross-border transactions that support business development. You will learn how business is conducted in an international environment and discover the links between international business management and the financial, technological, political forces affecting the world economy.

MAIN SUBJECTS: Finance, Corporate Economics, Business Planning, HR Management, General and Business Law, Management, Intercultural Management, Finance, Marketing, Corporate Finances, Business Informatics, World Economics, etc.

Tourism and Catering

BA | 6 semesters + 2 semesters internship | English

This undergraduate programme aims to train foreign language-speaking economists in the field of tourism and hospitality. You will be able to implement tasks related to tourism and hospitality as well as manage and organize related work processes. You will also possess a sound knowledge of economics, social theory, applied methodological, and specialized knowledge. You will be skilled in determining factors affecting demand, creating attractive and adventurous offers, and organizing related service activities.

MAIN SUBJECTS: Finance, Accounting, Statistics, Marketing, Geography of Tourism, Tourism Management, Hotel and Event Management, Gastronomy, Tourism Law, Project Management, History of Tourism, Foreign languages, etc.

International Economy and Business

Timber Industry Engineering

BSc | 7 semesters | English

As a graduate of the programme, you will lead the production of engineering structures (furniture, windows, doors, other wooden products) by utilizing and designing wood or wood-based materials. You will be expected to construct and organize the investments of mechanically, structurally, and technologically complex structures, respecting the natural and human environments. This study programme enables you to assume an active role in future technical developments in the timber industry and to further your education by entering a master programme.

MAIN SUBJECTS: Professional Knowledge (Wood Science, Sawmill Technology, Manufacturing Technology, Operation and Maintenance, Board and Panel Production, Furniture, Door, and Window Manufacturing, etc.), Natural Sciences, Economic and Human Knowledge

JOB OPPORTUNITIES: Primary and secondary processing industries of wood (sawmills, furniture factories, wood construction companies, etc.). Production management, wood trading, quality management, operating engineer, wood construction, logistics, wood protection, etc.

Timber Industry Engineering

MSc | 4 semesters | English

The goal of this study programme is professional training in wood processing technologies and utilization. You will achieve a high-level theoretical knowledge and practical skills in the technical, environmental, and financial aspects of wood utilization, processing and product development. You will learn to carry out foreman activities in the entire field of timber industry engineering.

MAIN SUBJECTS: Material Science and Mechanical Engineering, Design and Manufacturing Technology, Wood Protection, Natural Sciences, Economic and Human Knowledge, etc.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES: Primary and secondary processing industries of wood (sawmills, furniture factories, wood construction companies, etc.), research institutes and universities globally, Production management, wood trading, quality management, operating engineer, wood construction, logistics, wood protection, etc.

Wood Sciences and Technologies

PhD | 4 + 4 semesters | English

You will receive strong theoretical, research methodology and scientific backgrounds, and complete your research individually, with some guidance from your supervisor. Supervision is offered by the top experts and wood scientists in Hungary. The topics are typically linked to industrial research or innovation projects. As a doctoral graduate of the University of Sopron, you will not only have strong theoretical backgrounds, but also be a very practical scientist as well.

MAIN SUBJECTS: Research Methodology, Writing Scientific Publications, Applied Mathematics, Wood Sciences, Wood Processing Technologies and Creative Design, Wooden Constructions, Fibre and Nanotechnologies, Informatics in Wood Industry, Management in Wood Industry

Architecture Design and Theory

Focusing on topical challenges, the training also involves computer-aided architectural design (CAAD), and enhances parametric design skills.

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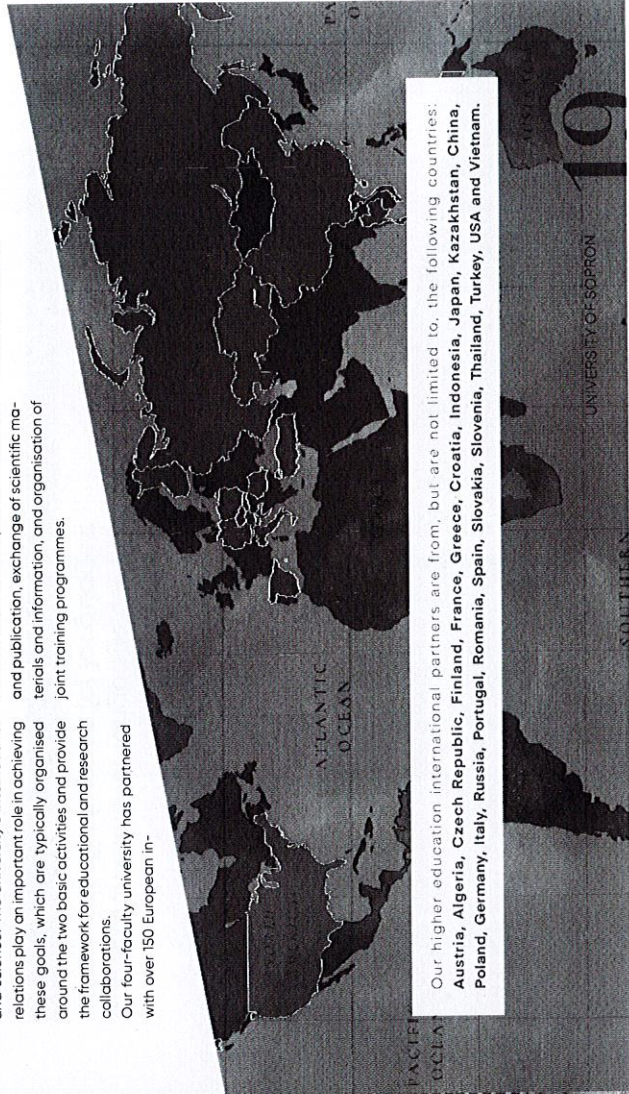
International Relations, Institutional Collaborations

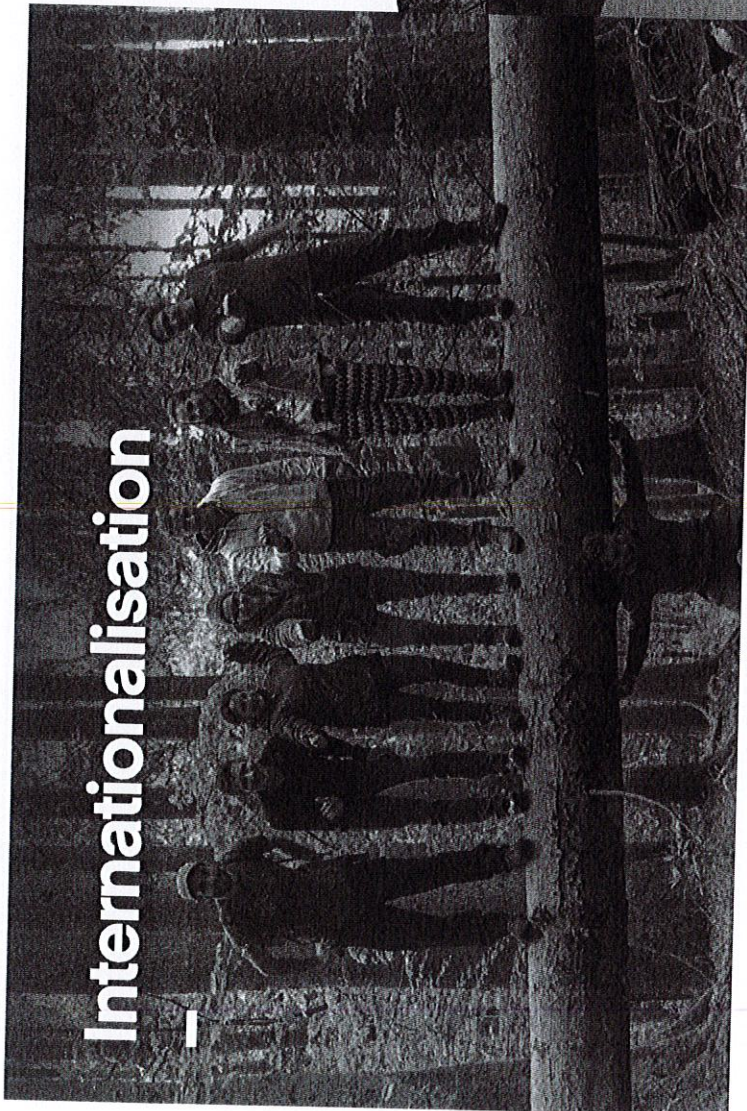

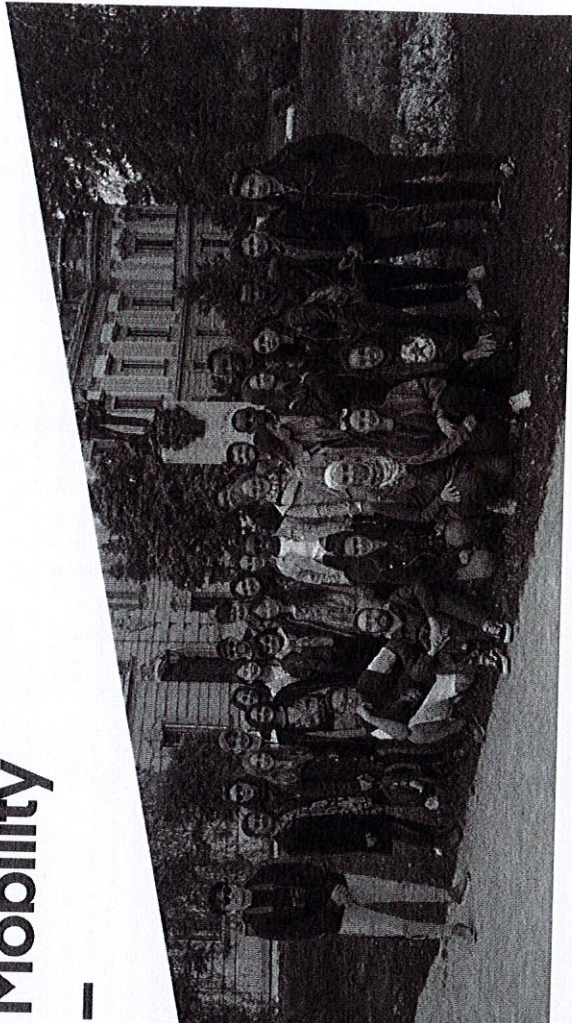

International Mobility



Our university's leadership places great importance and emphasis on the acceleration of our institution's internationalisation. The main objectives of our internationalisation Strategy are to increase international visibility, attract a greater number of foreign students, strengthen institutional collaborations, and expand mobility. We currently offer 20 accredited foreign language courses with- in the four faculties in economics, agricul-

ture, engineering, and pedagogy. For years, we have stressed the importance of interna- tional collaborative research projects, which we have expanded with participation in the H2020 programme. Participation in the Erasmus+ programme is essential to achieving our internationalisa- tion goals. International learning mobility (KAI) helps modernisation as an engine of quality development, and partnerships (KA2) result

in educational and research collaborations supporting innovation and the exchange of best practices, which are the initiators of pub- lications, know-how, training development, and improved professional and linguistic skills. In connection with its goals of international- isation, the University of Sopron continuously promotes the principles of environmental awareness, equal opportunities, and social responsibility.

Our mobility cooperation for education- al purposes is expanding, both as a result of and independently of inter-institution- al Erasmus agreements. Our university has more than 200 Erasmus+ KA103 connections in different subject areas, and the number of students, lecturers, and administrative staff participating in the programme is over 200 people per year. Erasmus+ KA107 partnerships in support of

international credit mobility are encouraged in the strategic field of forestry and timber in- dustry education, primarily to provide teach- er and student exchanges in our long and valued partnerships outside the EU. As part of the CEEPUS exchange programme, six of our networks offer faculty and student scholarships to outbound and inbound ex- change participants. Our students also take advantage of the scholarship opportunities Visegrad Fund.

The three-story science centre in the Botanical Garden, with its attractive exterior, interior, and image design solutions, is an exemplary work of architecture. Packed with modern, creative, interactive exhibitions and science-promoting cultural programmes, the impressive centre offers all age groups much to discover.

The centre's family-friendly layout, complete with touch screens, models, special decorations, and design elements invite visitors to become acquainted with the successful results, workshops, and innovations of the university's instructors and students, while the interactive learning wooden house offers the opportunity to 'Discover the wonderful world of forest and wood'. The Forest Protection and Vertebrate Zoological Collection

provides an impressive exhibition of over 300 preparations of exceptional value, which is a part of the university's Selmecbánya heritage. Conference and training rooms equipped with modern technology are popular venues for professional presentations and forums.

Botanical Garden

The Botanical Garden of the University of Sopron is over 100 years old and is home to more than 4,000 plant species.

Unlike traditional botanical gardens, Sopron's was established to support and supplement forestry education; consequently, it is mostly a collection of woody plants. Thanks to Sopron's climate, which is more balanced than the rest of Hungary, our garden is home to evergreens that do not survive elsewhere in the country due to climatic conditions, such as Siberian larch (*Larix sibirica*) and the country's tallest and largest Coast redwood (*Sequoia sempervirens*). The garden's great value lies in the fact that the majority of our plants come from their original habitats, and thus possess valuable genomes. Outstanding pine trees include *Abies*

homolepis, *Abies holopylla*, *Pinus ayacahuite*, *Pinus coulteri*, *Pinus parviflora*, *Sequoia giganteum*, *Metasequoia glyptostroboides*, *Torreya nucifera* among others. These, together with plots of East Asian and North American plants, are all spectacular parts of the garden. A total of 134 protected plants find a home in our garden, including purple cyclamen (*Cyclamen purpurascens*), white helleborine (*Cephalanthera damasonium*), and Carpathian crocus (*Crocus heuffelianus*), to mention but a few. When they bloom, these plants create colourful spectacles within the garden.

The lake in the upper garden presents Hungarian marsh flora. In addition to the beautiful and well-known white water lily (*Nymphaea alba*), there are a number of protected and less-known plants such as *Menyanthes trifoliata*, *Acorus calamus* and *Tropaeolans*. In the

double-winged greenhouse, you can enjoy a cactus collection and a collection of Mediterranean plants throughout the year. At the same place, we give place to various plant physiology and plant biology experiments of the university.

The garden has rich bird fauna: over 130 species of birds live here, 13 of which are protected. We have placed hundreds of bird boxes, feeders, and drinkers around the garden, all of which offer excellent birdwatching opportunities. Last but not least, there are countless monuments in the garden, indicating that historical changes of the past century have all left a mark here. We can admire the "Watch Fires" memorial, which remembers the battle of Ágfalva after the First World War, the "56th Memorial", which intends to draw our attention to the Hungarian Revolution of 1956, and the Miners and Metallurgist statues, which were exhibited to commemorate the changes in the life of the University.

Central Archives

The Central Archives, a common organisational unit that operates independently within the Central Library, collects and manages the historical material of the University of Sopron and its predecessors from 1862 to the present day. The stock of the archives founded in 1984 is currently 593.73 linear metres (73 fonds). The archive's services include research and customer service, support for historical research and data provision. Orientation is assisted by guides, databases, and digitized resources.

Memorial Library

The establishment of the Central Library's Memorial Library coincides with the founding of the first Hungarian training school for mining officers in Selmecbánya (1735). The first organisational and academic regulations, which can be considered a founding document, required the 'acquisition of works of renowned authors', as well as the obligation for students to 'read each other the works of the mining school in their free hours'. The library began operating in 1735; the same year studies were initiated. The memorial room of the Central Library building contains a portion of the collection, about 12,000 volumes divided into 12 professional groups.

Central Library

The Central Library of the University of Sopron is a public higher education library. Through its conventional and electronic services and resources, the Central Library and its member libraries ensure and provide the material needed for university education, learning and research, information provision, lifelong learning preparation, and effective time investment.

The university library network, with its unique collection, is integrated into the National Document Supply System and the national and international professional information services. The collection exceeds 300,000 library units. The main collection circles include: forestry, wood industry, geodesy, wildlife management, economics, pedagogy, arts and related disciplines, and the literature of border areas.

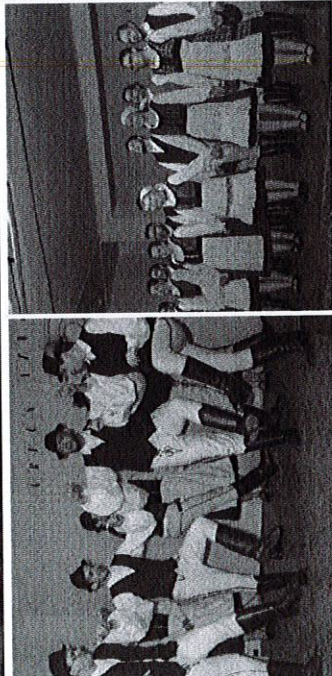

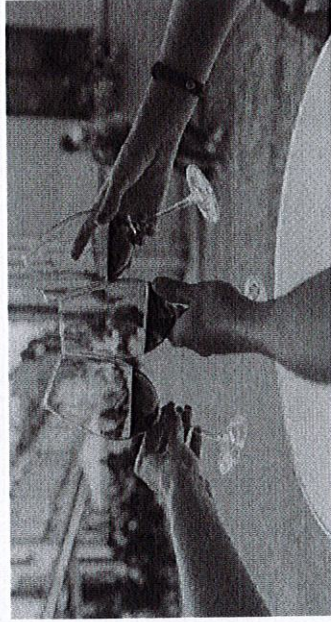
Telekom VOLT Festival

INTERNATIONALISATION

Our university's leadership places great importance and emphasis on the acceleration of our institution's internationalisation. We currently offer 20 accredited foreign language courses within the four faculties in economics, agriculture, engineering, and pedagogy. Participation in the Erasmus+ programme is essential to achieving our internationalisation goals. International learning mobility (KA1) helps modernisation as an engine of quality development, and partnerships (KA2) result in educational and research collaborations supporting innovation and the exchange of best practices, which are the initiators of publications, know-how, training development, and improved professional and linguistic skills. In connection with its goals of internationalisation, the University of Sopron continuously promotes the principles of environmental awareness, equal opportunities, and social responsibility.

INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY

Our university has more than 200 Erasmus+ KA103 connections in different subject areas, and the number of students, lecturers, and administrative staff participating in the programme is over 200 people per year. Erasmus+ KA107 partnerships in support of international credit mobility are encouraged in the strategic field of forestry and timber industry education, primarily to provide teacher and student exchanges in our long and valued partnerships outside the

EU. As part of the CEEPUS exchange programme, six of our networks offer faculty and student scholarships to outbound and inbound exchange participants. Our students also take advantage of the scholarship opportunities offered in the Campus Mundi programme available for studies and internships, thanks to which they can travel to almost any part of the world and gain intercultural, professional, and linguistic experience as well as build strong relationships.



BOTANICAL GARDEN

The Botanical Garden of the University of Sopron is over 100 years old and is home to more than 4,000 plant species. Unlike traditional botanical gardens, Sopron's was established to support and supplement forestry education; consequently, it is mostly a collection of woody plants. Thanks to Sopron's climate, which is more balanced than the rest of Hungary, our garden is home to evergreens that do not survive elsewhere in the country due to climatic conditions, such as Siberian larch (*Larix sibirica*) and the country's tallest and largest Coast redwood (*Sequoia sempervirens*). Outstanding pine trees include *Abies homolepis*, *Abies holopylla*, *Pinus ayacahuite*, *Pinus coulteri*, *Pinus parviflora*, *Sequoia giganteum*, *Metasequoia glyptostroboides*, *Torreya nucifera* among others. A total of 134 protected plants find a home in our garden, including purple cyclamen (*Cyclamen purpurascens*), white helleborine (*Cephalanthera damasonium*), and Carpathian crocus (*Crocus heuffelianus*), to mention but a few. When they bloom, these plants create colourful spectacles within the garden. The lake in the upper garden presents Hungarian marsh flora. In addition to the beautiful and well-

known white water lily (*Nymphaea alba*), there are a number of protected and less-known plants such as *Menyanthes trifoliata*, *Acorus calamus* and

Central Library

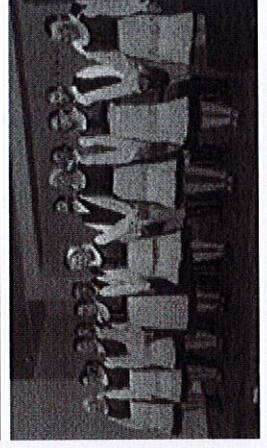
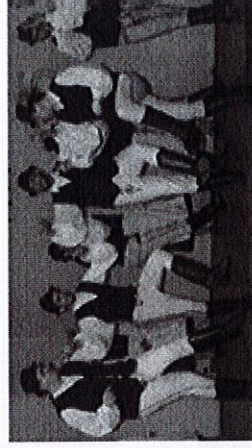
The Central Library of the University of Sopron is a public higher education library. Through its conventional and electronic services and resources, the Central Library and its member libraries ensure and provide the material needed for university education, learning and research, information provision, lifelong learning preparation, and effective time investment. The collection exceeds 300,000 library units. The main collection circles include: forestry, wood industry, geodesy, wildlife management, economics, pedagogy, arts and related disciplines, and the literature of border areas.

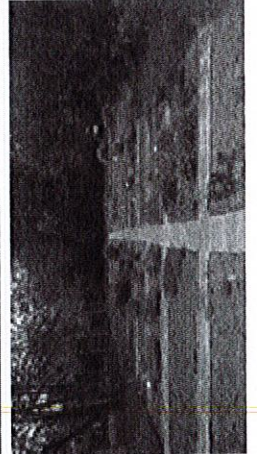
Ürmös Folk Dance Group of Sopron

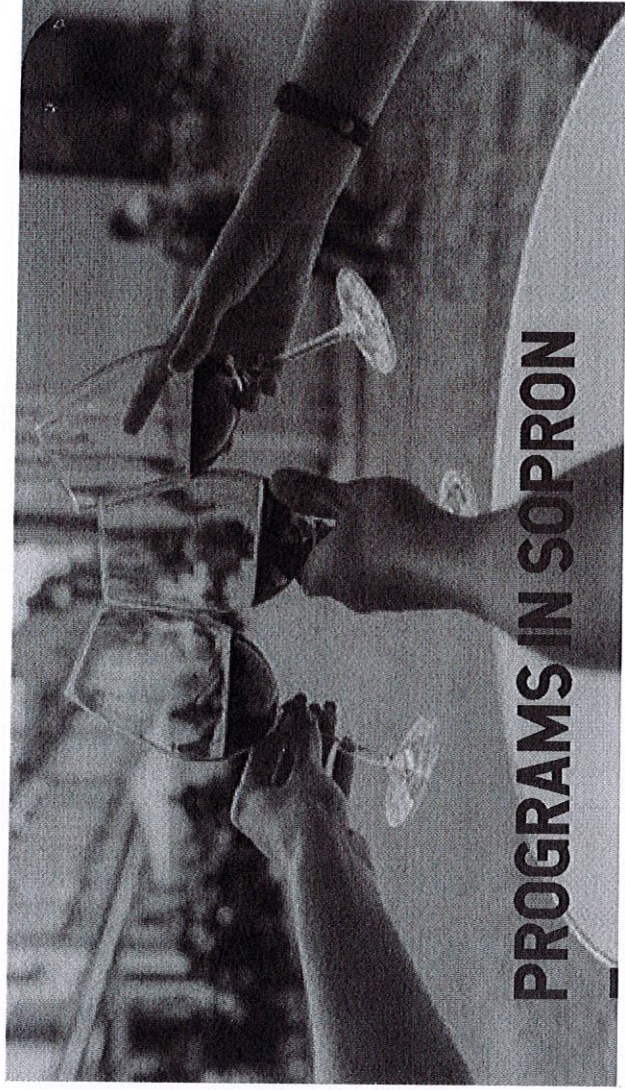
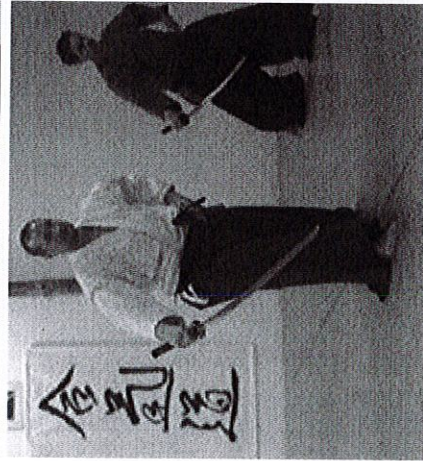
Trapa natans. In the double-winged greenhouse, you can enjoy a cactus collection and a collection of Mediterranean plants throughout the year. At the same place, we give place to various plant physiology and plant biology experiments of the university. The garden has rich bird fauna; over 130 species of birds live here,

13 of which are protected. We have placed hundreds of bird boxes, feeders, and drinkers around the garden, all of which offer excellent birdwatching opportunities. Last but not least, there are countless monuments in the garden, indicating that historical changes of the past century have all left a mark here.



SPORT LIFE

Sports and athletics have a 150-year history at the University of Sopron. Students have been able to test their skills and strength in many sports (e.g. basketball, handball, football, orienteering, skiing); the organisational framework is provided by the Sopron University Club for Athletics and Football (SMAFC), and the venue is the Krasznai Ferenc Sport Hall. Students organise the highly successful 'Raging Cup' championship in several sports (football, basketball, volleyball) Sports and recreation opportunities at the university include: basketball, volleyball, aerobics, five-a-side football, swimming, badminton, squash, and Nordic walking. The University Sports Office organises and conducts sports opportunities and events.



PROGRAMS IN SOPRON

Sopron Festival Weeks

With more than a half-century of history behind it, Sopron Festival Weeks is one of Sopron's biggest art festivals. An over month-long series of events featuring contributions from local artist and art groups awaits visitors. During this time, theatre performances, outdoor programs, fairs, folklore performances, church concertpop music concerts, outdoor concerts in the city's squares, programs for children, and art and crafts exhibitions fill the squares and courtyards of the historical downtown.

Wine Festival Sopron

The series of events take place on Várkerület. This festival traditionally celebrates the local wines and outdoor concerts in the town's squares. More than 20 local winemakers, culinary delights, artisan spirits, honey, marmalades, and a craft fair await visitors.

Outdoor Music Performances and Street Music Festival

Dozens of local and Sopron-related bands and musicians perform at the most spectacular sites within the city.

Telekom VOLT Festival

Organised and held annually in Sopron since 1993, the VOLT Festival is one of Hungary's biggest music festivals, offering a wide range of rock, electronic, world, jazz, and many other forms of music at multiple locations. Many famous international artists and musicians perform at the festival, which attracts an ever increasing array of international (mainly Eastern and Western European) visitors each year.

ENTERTAINMENT FACILITIES IN SOPRON

Lövér Adventure Park

With 120 obstacles, the Adventure Park's ropeways offer you exciting challenges and unforgettable experiences. Between completing the two courses, you can enjoy a game of table tennis with your friends. Búgócsiga Akusztik Garden

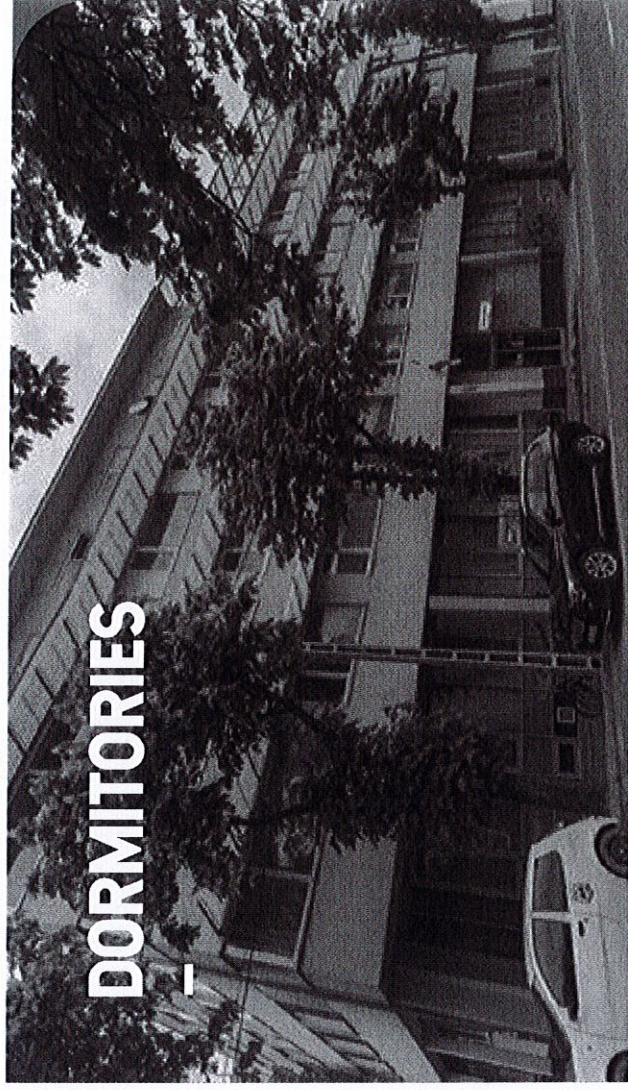

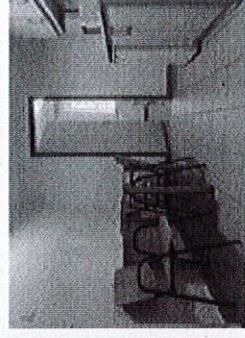
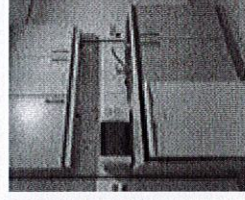
DORMITORIES

In Sopron, we offer student accommodation in three building complexes.
